- 2 kids who attend church today (with their mom) but whose Dad is looking to divorce their mom. She could not afford to cost of camp.
- 1 boy, son of a tradesman who is doing a job for believers. The boy has disconnected from school and is being bullied. He also was unaware of who Jesus is."

Rebekah and Gregory want to be able to sponsor more such kids next year!

Things got a bit hectic during the camp's last night when, at midnight, one of the young girls came down with appendicitis. Her counselor had just fallen sick and was in isolation. Gregory worked on finding someone to stay with the other girls while Rebekah went with the sick girl to the local hospital. While they prepped her for surgery (appendicitis) Rebekah tried in vain to call both parents. By the time someone answered (around 10am the next morning) the crisis had subsided. Feeling better, the young girl was allowed to leave the hospital and she decided to stay until the end of the camp and hold her part in the short play her girls had prepared.
